## BURNS & McDONNELL SELECTED TO PROVIDE AEC SERVICES FOR \$200 MILLION B-21 BEDDOWN

KANSAS CITY, Missouri — As the U.S. Air Force prepares to bring the B-21 Raider — a next-generation long-range bomber aircraft — into service, Burns & McDonnell has been named one of three companies selected to provide architecture, engineering and construction (AEC) services as part of the aircraft's beddown mission.

The seven-year, \$200 million contract will help the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and Air Force Civil Engineer Center plan and build the necessary facilities to meet the needs of the new weapons system. Ellsworth Air Force Base in South Dakota was selected to house the first B-21 aircraft and the formal training unit.
