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Evergy and Burns & McDonnell Partner With RGMA to Launch New Supplier Diversity Business Development Program



The program's training will be led by Ralph Moore, president, CEO and founder of RGMA. Moore was the lead training resource for the National Minority Supplier Development Council (NMSDC) for 24 years. He created the RGMA 5-Levels of Supplier Diversity™ maturity model and the RGMA 10 Components of a World-Class Supplier Diversity Program, which served as the model for the development of the NMSDC Eight Best Practices. Through Accelerate, participating diverse business owners as well as sponsoring participants from Burns & McDonnell and Evergy will receive instruction in 10 critical strategies that work in sync to drive world-class supplier diversity results. The program will run until August and will form the basis of a virtual training program that will expand in 2024.
